Making Compound Sentences

Compound sentences are made when combining two independent sentences with a **comma** and a **conjunction**.

Conjunctions- *and, or, but, so*

Two independent sentences- *Irene made a birthday wish.
Tim blew out the candles*

Compound Sentence:
Irene made a birthday wish, and Tim blew out the candles
